COMMANDER'S REPORT— BY JAKE SCHU

I want to sincerely thank all of the officers and members who contributed time and effort to help with our projects and events over the last seven (7) years. Our programs have been successful because of your leadership and member dedication. Together we spearheaded, organized, attended and supported the following activities during that time:

- We have a website since 2011, a Facebook page and we publish our newsletter in the format you see, starting from 2012. I created and currently maintain these. We started issuing printed meeting agendas and minutes in 2012 at the request of our membership. We spearheaded and dedicated a WWI monument in the Lancaster Veterans Park in 2014 that relocated the WWI plaque originally mounted on Lancaster Washington Post 283 on Legion Pkwy. We designed and commemorated Korean War and Vietnam War monuments in Depew Veterans park in 2014, including an extension of the existing pad. We relocated the 3" M5 gun to Depew's Veterans Park, including a new concrete pad and dedication plaque in 2015. The M5 Gun relocation, including engineering the current pad and move as well as the engineering for all other projects was conducted by Post 1528, in house, using the incredible talent we have in our membership. Special thanks to Dick Bulman and Bob Sharpe for their incredible support and talent! We recently secured help from Line-X in Depew to move the gun to a facility in Buffalo to be sand blasted and repainted, thanks to Jim Wolfe. This brings to fruition an effort spanning over two years. We are hopeful this process can be completed by Memorial Day 2019. Special thanks to Don Schram for his amazing efforts in securing donations for this undertaking! Our Grave Registration Project was designated at my request in 2012 as the Commander's project and has grown substantially under guidance and due-diligence from our Graves Registration Chair, Jack Betz. I reinstated Executive Committee meetings, which had not been done in many years, and we now have at least two Executive Committee meetings every year. This is comprised of our Post officers, any Past Post Commanders who wish to attend, our Membership Chair Mike Johnson and Quartermaster Wally Waiss. Generally, these meetings are held in February and August. I requested, and we completed, a revised Constitution and Bylaws, compiled and issued in 2016, for the first time since 1991. I requested performing the POW/MIA ceremony at our meetings, complete with the ceremonial table, in 2014 and this now continues at every meeting. We also perform this ceremony annually on Veterans day at the Elks dinner. All this has been accomplished by our Post, with valuable input and effort from our members, officers and committee chairs. Last year, we welcomed VFW Post 7275 and AMVETS Post 7275 to the Depew Joint Veterans Committee at my suggestion and it has been working out great. I originally designed the DJVC logo in 2015 and then redesigned it to include the VFW logo in 2018.
- Our Post, along with AMVETS Post 7275 and VFW Post 7275 participated on the Depew Founder's Day events and parades for the last two years, for another first.
- We can always use help with our events and committees. Please consider becoming active in your Post. Many are doing double duty to fill needed positions.
- I have attended all but a few of Erie County meetings and continue to do so as best I can.
- I continue to support Legion websites for Post 1528, Erie County and ECAL Veterans for Veterans. The County Legion website can be found at the following URL: **<http://www.eriecountyal.org>**
- There have been a few changes to the officers list since our elections in May. Jack Betz is now our Adjutant and Rich Walczak is now Finance Officer, as Don Schram stepped down due to health reasons but remains active. Mike Johnson remains membership Chair and Jack Betz remains Graves Registration Chair. Jim Wolfe stepped

- Depew Post 1528 again did the cooking for the Special Olympics party at the Lamm Post this year. Thanks to Dick Bulman, Don Schram and Chet Pawlowski for their time and efforts. We grilled about 140 hamburgers! Post 1528 also donates to this event every year.
- Remember to support the other veterans organizations in our area. We have AMVETS Post 14, AMVETS Post 7275 and VFW Post 7275 within a mile or two of Post 1528. Hot dogs and refreshments will be at the Depew fire hall on Meridian St. following the ceremony. We will pick up flags on Tuesday, May 28th. Meet at St. Adalberts at 1000.



AMERICAN LEGION 100TH ANNIVERSARY

This year commemorates the 100th anniversary of our organization. The American Legion was chartered by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veterans organization. Focusing on service to veterans, service members and communities, the Legion evolved from a group of war-weary veterans of World War I into one of the most influential non-profit groups in the United States. Membership swiftly grew to over 1 million, and local posts sprang up across the country. Today, membership stands at over 2 million in 55 departments: one each for the 50 states, along with the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, France, Mexico and the Philippines. Over the years, the Legion has influenced considerable social change in America, won hundreds of benefits for veterans and produced many important programs for children and youth. Following is a chronology of significant dates in Legion history:

March 15-17

Members of the American Expeditionary Force convene in Paris for the first American Legion caucus.

May 8-10

St. Louis Caucus. "The American Legion" is adopted as the organization's official name. The Legion's draft preamble and constitution are approved.

June 9

The National Executive Committee adopts the Legion emblem.

Sept. 16

Congress charters The American Legion.

Nov. 10-12

First Legion convention convenes in Minneapolis. The Constitution and preamble are adopted. Delegates vote 361-323 to locate the Legion's national headquarters in Indianapolis, instead of Washington. A resolution is passed in support of Boy Scouts of America. *Today, the Legion is the chartering agency for more than 1,700 Scouting units made up of approximately 64,000 youths.*

POST 1528 GRAVES REGISTRATION PROJECT— JACK BETZ, CHAIR

Jack has completed grave registration work on 4 of the 5 cemeteries under Post 1528's jurisdiction. This task includes compiling cemetery records, fragmented and incomplete records that cover deceased Veterans from the Indian Wars to present service. In the past 4+ years since volunteering Jack has spent over **4,500 hours and has walked over 46,000 grave sites and identified more than 4,700 veteran's graves.** The following is a breakdown by cemetery: LANCASTER RURAL: 100% complete 19,200 sites; 806 Veterans; St. ADALBERTS: 100% complete 20,100 sites; 2,092 Veterans; St. AUGUSTINES: 100% complete 5,330 sites; 603 Veterans; Sacred heart: 100% complete 1,340 sites; 165 Veterans. These 4 cemeteries are now on a maintenance schedule where Jack will contact them monthly to update our files. Jack will be starting this month to survey St. MARYS: 0% complete 11,300 sites; 610 Veterans. As always, if you know of a veteran that may be buried in one of these cemeteries, please contact Jack so that he may follow up on that person and add them to our data base.
